Annual Meeting & Luncheon

It was a typical Florida August day, hot and humid. Even with the summer weather 59 walkers showed up for the Oviedo walk and approximately 35 attended the annual meeting / luncheon. The walk which started and ended at Froggers in Oviedo went through several neighborhoods. The air conditioning and cold drinks at Froggers after the walk were appreciated by all.

The annual meeting was held after everyone ate their fill. The minutes from the 2010 meeting and the treasurer's report were approved. Letty Zook provided an update on membership and passed out membership cards to those that had paid their dues for 2011/12. Letty reported that there were 46 single memberships, and 36 family memberships for a total of 125 members.

Elections were held for Vice-President and Secretary. Pete Fournier was re-elected VP and Rosemary Barna was re-elected Secretary. The revisions to the Constitution/By-laws were approved with a few minor changes. The first of the year round walk t-shirts were handed out. Dave Bundy, Mike Lanpher and Joan Lanpher qualified for the t-shirts by walking 15 Year Round Events in the first half of the year. Those individuals that walk 15 events by the end of Nov will get their t-shirts at the Christmas meeting in December.

At the AVA Convention this year a change was made to the rules concerning Year Round Events. The rule previously was that you could walk a Year Round Event for event credit once each six months. This has been changed so that you can now walk a Year Round Event for credit once each day of the year.



Gail Brooks, President of MFMs, announced that from September 1st through December 31st of this year all credit walkers will be able to walk a regular MFM event for free (you still have to pay for any year arounds).

Congratulations to Jackie Walchuck, Jo-anne Cross, and Sue Rudy, each a winner of a \$25 gift certificate. Their names were drawn from all members who renewed before July 1. Thanks for such a good response this year.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 1:30PM.

Walking in Wisconsin

Joan and I stopped in Eau Claire while driving back from her Mom's in Washington State. We did 12 YREs and a couple non YREs in Parks while traveling and it was hard to separate them from 2 great YRE walks in the Tetons, a walk in Natural Bridges, and a walk ("Sound of Silence") in Dinosaur National Monument.

Eau Claire is on the intersection of the Eau Claire (your HS French says "clear water") and the Chipawa rivers. The route is diverse with Carson Park and Hank Aaron's first ball club -

the Eau Claire Bears; two rivers, a neat Farmer's Market (if Saturday), 1890 homes, pedestrian bridges over the rivers, sculptures, and nice trails. Need to mention the instructions were good.

The thing that you do 1st off is go up 100 feet to Carson Park and the base-

ball stadium from the Dairy Queen start point (and you end up there too). Then down and across the Canal between rivers and follow the walk/bike trail into town and across the first of three pedestrian bridges. There the neat Farmer's Market was accompanied by a band in the adjacent Park. Into town and a myriad of sculptures. The Pony pictured was a favorite. Then across the 2d pedestrian bridge into the second park along the Chipawa where the "Hand" sculpture was located

(2d one we saw). Then into an old section with 6+ massive 1890-1900 homes and passed into the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire campus and across their pedestrian bridge to another part of the campus. We finished by walking a couple Ks along the Chipawa returning to the finish for a Raspberry Blizzard - yum.

New Special Walk Programs for Next Year



"Moving together toward a healthier America"

Bakeries

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. Walk 20 AVA sanctioned Volksmarches that pass a family-owned bakery to earn the Bakery patch. Any sanctioned AVA event that includes a family-owned bakery and whose walk route goes by the bakery will qualify for the Bakeries program. Chains such as Krispy Kreme or Panera Bread, for example, do not count.

Classic Cinemas Theaters

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. Celebration Golden Cinemas. Any sanctioned AVA event in the U.S. that passes a building that currently or historically served as a classic movie theater, defined as being built more than 50 years ago, qualifies. Use an event stamp once per calendar year. Not retroactive. Book costs \$10.

Diners

Begins January 2012. Classic American Diners. 20 walks fill the book. The book is \$10, and will be available in December of 2011. Historically, a small restaurant owner had a prefab dining car type diner shipped to a site, set up, and went into business. Generally, if it calls itself a "diner" it qualifies. Restaurants without the word "diner" qualify if they are in a traditional diner building, OR serve diner style. Closed diners qualify. Old dining car style diners now used for something else also qualify. What doesn't qualify? Fast food chains, coffee shops, and donut shops are not diners. We will maintain a website with more information, and a Facebook page. The name and location of the diner is the only identification required. Award is a beautiful color patch.

Main Street

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. Strutin' Down Main Street. Complete 20 different sanctioned events where the route goes for at least one block on the

main street of any town in the world. An event counts if, in any language, the word for "main" is in the name of the street, avenue, boulevard, lane, court, circle, row, etc. Participants will be awarded a "Strike up the Band" parade patch and whistle certificate. Books can be ordered now but they will be sent starting on December 10, 2011. Cost is \$10.

Murals

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. Walking America's Murals. Walk 20 qualifying events. A qualifying event is any sanctioned walk that passes a mural of at least 8' x 8' depicting any historical, cultural or local happening on a painted stationary wall or building. Award is a 3' x 4' patch. Books are \$10 each: make checks payable to Illinois Trekkers.

Rainbows

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. Strolling Somewhere Over the Rainbow. Complete 20 different sanctioned events where the route is located in or in sight of a color-named place anywhere in the world: any city, county, country, area (like Black Hills), place (like Yellowstone Park), state (like Nevada - known as "The Silver State"), rivers or any body of water, or mountains with the name of a color in it. Names for any and all shades of colors also qualify. Award is a patch and certificate.

WPA Works Project Administration

Runs January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. USA 1935-1943 WPA. Award is a 3" x 4" embroidered patch. Walk 20 YREs or scheduled events that pass anything to do with the WPA: art in a post office, dams, bridges, buildings, park entrances, swimming pools and even sidewalks. The program costs \$10.
